The Pasadena Arts Foundation proudly presents the **Pasadena Fall Fun Ring**, featuring classes and massed ringing with the artists of **Timbré**, some of the best known and well-respected teachers and performers in handbells. We are offering a "Cafeteria Style" event with three options for you to choose from, and we will present our concert in the church's sanctuary featuring PPC's majestic Aeolian-Skinner Pipe Organ, one of the largest and finest instruments of its kind in Southern California. OPTION 1 – Friday night and Saturday morning classes, plus massed ringing: There are two 50-minute class sessions offered on Friday night and two on Saturday morning. See the information page for class offerings and descriptions. Massed ringing begins at 11:00 am on Saturday. Concert is at 5:00 pm. The concert is free and open to the public. (Free-Will Offering)

OPTION 2 – Saturday morning classes plus massed ringing: Choose this option if you can't make it Friday night, but still want to take classes. See the information page for class offerings and descriptions. Massed ringing begins at 11:00 am. Concert is at 5:00 pm. The concert is free and open to the public. (FWO)

OPTION 3 – Saturday massed Ringing only: Just what it says on the tin. No classes, just massed ringing on Saturday. Massed ringing begins at 11:00 am. Concert is at 5:00 pm. The concert is free and open to the public. (FWO)

Come as a choir or an individual ringer! Either way, please bring your own bells and music. If you cannot bring your own bells, please contact Michèle at **Diva@Timbre-Ensemble.org** and she will see what she can do to find bells for you to ring. If desired, individual ringers may be added to incomplete groups.

We will provide lunch on Saturday to attendees at a cost of \$5 per person. If you choose not to take advantage of this opportunity, there is plenty of space on campus to eat if you bring your own lunch, or there are a few restaurants not far from the church. If you choose to go to a restaurant, we recommend placing your order in advance since there's only 30 minutes for lunch!

Your registration will be confirmed by email shortly after it is received. Walk-in registrants are welcome at the door (at full registration price, plus a \$5 surcharge), as long as we have room. Early registration helps our planning, so please register as soon as possible! All groups, **no matter their skill level**, are encouraged to play a solo piece during the concert. This is a safe space for all of us to learn from each other, encourage each other, and to build our presentation skills. There will be a limit of FOUR (4) solo/ensemble pieces (first-come, first-served). The concert will last about an hour.

REPERTOIRE

We deliberately chose the repertoire to be an easier level because we recognize that this festival occurs early in the ringing season and some choirs don't start up until mid-September. Two of the pieces are specifically for Advent/Christmas and two for general use, so we hope you can use them before and after Christmas!

Please purchase and prepare the music in advance. The festival conductors will work on the interpretation of the music, not the assignments or working out of the piece.

Although there are four pieces on the repertoire list, ensembles and/or individuals may pick and choose those pieces they wish to prepare and perform for the final concert.

- 1. *Processional Alleluia*, by Kevin McChesney. 3-5 oct handbells with optional organ or brass. Level 1+. Jeffers Handbell Supply, JHS9191. (Conducted by **Michèle Sharik**.)
- 2. *German Carol Medley*, arr. Sandra Eithun. 3-5 oct handbells with optional SATB choir. Level 2. Choristers Guild, CGB899. (Conducted by **KatRyn Howell**.)
- 3. '*Twas in the Moon of Wintertime*, by Cathy Mocklebust. It has both 2-3 octave versions and 3-5 octave versions which are compatible for massed ringing, and has optional percussion (chime tree, finger cymbals, tambourine). Level 2. Choristers Guild, CGB155 = 2-3 octave version, CGB402 = 3-5 octave version. (Conducted by Elizabeth Mays.)
- 4. *Antiphony of Joy*, arr. by Lloyd Larson. Handbell Choir I (4-6 octaves), Handbell Choir II (2 octaves: 8 notes), optional organ, and optional congregational singing. Level 2+. Beckenhorst Press, BEHB190. (Conducted by **Michèle Sharik**.)

FRIDAY NIGHT:

SESSION ONE (6:30-7:20 pm):

Basics Revisited: Your 100,000 Measure Tune-Up, taught by Michèle Sharik

Whether you're a brand new beginner or a "veteran ringer", this class will teach (or remind) you what to do before you ever pick up a bell or chime. Learn evidence-based ergonomic techniques to help you not only "survive" those long rehearsals, concerts, and day-long ringing festivals, but also do so without pain or soreness. Ringers will be introduced to the "Three S's: Stance, Seat, and Stroke", and will focus on developing a relaxed ringing style to help control the bell, ring dynamically, and make beautiful music.

Different Assignment Strategies, taught by KatRyn Howell

Covering the many ways bells have been assigned, from Allured to the present. Offering different triedand-true methods; why and when they are useful. Ideas for small groups, or for groups that are suddenly smaller.

SESSION TWO (7:30-8:20 pm):

Dream Weaving, taught by Carol Pickford

In this hands-on class, you'll master the "weave" technique with three bells, four bells, and more. Find out how weaving can help you wend your way through difficult musical passages without getting warped!

Coordination Conundrums, taught by Michèle Sharik

Looking for that next-level challenge? Good coordination is essential to making music safely with handbells and chimes. Come break, er, BUILD your brain as we tackle the exercises in Valerie Stephenson's "Coordination Conundrums"!

SATURDAY MORNING:

SESSION THREE (8:00-8:50 am):

Intro to Four-in-Hand: Use it or Lose It, taught by Mary Liao

You'll learn the most popular and useful methods of ringing two bells in each hand, how to decide which to use when, and how to do them safely and musically.

Score Study, taught by Elizabeth Mays

Learn to access the deeper meanings in the music by examining every element. We dig deep and learn how to discover and realize the composer's intentions to ultimately make better music. Bring an open mind; leave with new tools to access musicality and meaning!

SESSION FOUR (9:00-9:50 am):

Beyond the Basics: Articulations, taught by Carol Pickford

So you can ring and damp. Can you martellato? Tap pluck? Thumb damp? Make it sing? Join this class to learn how to execute these special techniques and more, including shake, swing, gyro, echo, vibrato, and even a ring touch that won't leave a mark! We'll also learn the notation indicators for these techniques and which work (and how to modify them) for handchimes.

Full Hands, Full Hearts: Advanced Four-in-Hand, taught by Mary Liao

Going beyond Shelley and Ring & Push, Mary will show you other useful (though perhaps lesserknown) methods to help you tackle any musical problem. If time allows, she'll even teach you her amazing "XYZ Six-in-Hand"!

This event is endorsed by Area 12 of Handbell Musicians of America. As such, there are certain policies we must follow:

The Guild is committed to upholding the copyright laws of the United States and protecting the rights of our publishers, arrangers, and composers. Each performance folder must have legally purchased copies of the music used at this event. Photocopied music will not be permitted, except with written authorization from the copyright holder. Your paid registration certifies that you will purchase AND WILL BRING published copies of all copyrighted music used by you and/or your group during the event.

If you wish to use a tablet computer to hold your music in place of standard paper copies on a music stand, you must contact the publisher of each piece of music to first obtain permission to convert a purchased piece of music to the format required for the tablet you are using. Copies of the written permission received from publishers must be presented on request from the event organizer or Handbell Musicians of America staff. Permission from a publisher for one piece does not imply permission for other pieces from the same publisher. The title of each piece used in this format must be included in the written permission received. Attendee should also have legally purchased copies of all music with them for verification.

Finally, membership in the Guild is strongly encouraged. A director or church/school can join for an annual fee of \$95 for their entire choir (or a monthly fee of \$8). If individual choir members want to receive access to online resources, they can join for a sub-membership of \$10/year. There are also membership options for full-time students and retired handbell musicians! And she loved every minute of it!

A handbell soloist with 30+ years of performance experience, **Mary Liao** specializes in solo techniques, traveling 6iH, and small ensembles. She performed a solo concert for the Guild's 2015 Pinnacle event in Dallas, TX, and has taught workshops and classes with Timbré in Utah, Idaho, Wyoming, Nebraska, & Missouri. She currently teaches at Arcadia Presbyterian Church and directs the East Valley Handbell Program in Walnut, CA.

After earning her bachelor degree in handbells from Redlands University in 2012, **Elizabeth Mays** went on to complete TWO Masters of Music degrees from Azusa Pacific University, one in handbell performance and the other in instrumental conducting. By day, she works as the Student Services & Admissions Director for Anaheim University. On those rare occasions when she's not ringing bells, she enjoys creating dreamcatchers, needlepoint, and latch hook. She might also be found dancing, cooking, or practicing her swordsmanship! Beth serves as Historian for Area 12, and blames it all on her mother.

Carol Pickford has been playing bells for nearly 40 years. She started when her father brought her to a newlyformed group and said "We are going to do this!", touching off a genuine love of the instrument. She has played almost continuously throughout the 40 years — she even met her husband playing bells! — and currently plays in Timbré and two church choirs.

The founding Artistic Director of Timbré, **Michèle Sharik** is an internationally-renowned handbell soloist, conductor, and teacher.
